

GPM is directly correlated with psi-the higher the pressure, the more water the machine will use per minute. Light machines can only use 1.5 gpm, while professional models can reach up to 4 gpm. When shopping for a pressure washer, you'll want to consider psi first, but keep an eye on the gpm, too.
